Investing in Your Community

\$1/week or \$52/year provides two families with emergency food in times of need.

\$20/week or \$1,000/year provides two weeks of shelter, food and safety to a woman and her children fleeing abuse.

\$48/week or \$2,500/year provides crisis intervention and support for more than 100 people.

United Way of South Niagara Funded Programs & Services Resulted in:

- 74,934** meals served/delivered to needy children, families and adults.
 - 1,455** distress calls answered annually in South Niagara area.
 - 280** children took part in mentoring programs.
 - 138** abused women accessed Court Support Program which provided basic legal information and referrals.
 - 74** families received quality licensed child care enabling at risk parents to continue their education and/or access community supports.
